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datscha radio¹⁷ – The Programme

The programme for Datscha Radio 17 is complete.

Straight from an allotment garden in Berlin-Rosenthal, Datscha Radio 17 will broadcast radio art, talks, features, concerts and live performances for 5 days from 25th-29th August, live over the airwayes.

This radiophonic garden festival will (at specified times) be broadcast on the VHF frequency 88.4fm in Berlin (and 90.7fm in Potsdam) and can be heard throughout the entire festival on Mini-FM in the garden, and as a livestream online.

The overarching theme of the festival is **Plots & Prophecies | Parzellenprognosen**, where each day a new theme is presented which artistically reflects the present facets of ecological change. Thus **Hortus Politicus**, the opening day on Friday 25th of August, is devoted - not without reason - to the conflicting priorities of garden and society. Topics include (among others) the future of urban 'Kleingärten' in times of decreasing building land and - with a view to the 18th century - the social model of the baroque garden. Sunday 27th is the day when future biotopes and plant communications will be envisaged. On Monday 28th, the day of **Birds and Bees**, cuckoo researcher Edgar Percival Chance will present an artistic radio improvisation, and a live concert will be performed especially for garden animals.

Datscha Radio 17 will begin its live programme daily at noon with the Morning Chorus. The subsequent Discussion at Noon will take place on Friday, Saturday and Monday in cooperation with the Bildungswerk Berlin of the Heinrich Böll Foundation. In the afternoons and evenings, radio art and live performances will be presented in real-time. Every day, one hour before midnight, a Guest Stream especially produced for Datscha Radio 17 can be heard, designed by radio activists from (but not limited to) Graz/Austria, Dunedin/New Zealand and Tokyo/Japan. In the Night Loop, from 1am-9am, the best of the Open Call submissions will be matched to daily themes and sent into the aether. The one-hour Morning Field at 9am will present sound works produced for Datscha Radio 17. From 10am, the series World Gardeners assembles contributions from garden initiatives and original sound recordings from around the world.

Datscha Radio is the only garden radio project in the world to date. 2017 will see the third installment of this unique series.
